- 2. With careful reading, Junot Diaz's "How to Date a Browngirl, Blackgirl, Whitegirl, or Halfie" appears to be less about dating and more about other insecurities in Yunior's life. Discuss a minimum of three things about which Yunior is insecure, giving evidence from the text to support all points you make. (30 points)
- 3. In both "Pu-239" and "How to Date...," the main character is looking for fulfillment through something that they do not understand. In what ways are the searches for fulfillment of Yunior and Timofey similar? In what ways are the searches different? Explore these searches, focusing on at least two main similarities and two main differences. Support all points that you make with evidence from the text. (40 points)
