Collaborative Report 2.0

The primary function of the report is for you to tell me why you deserve an "A" on this collaborative project. What are the ways in which you contributed to the group? How did your contributions help the group directly (finding sources, writing up pieces of the webography) and indirectly (organizing meetings, negotiating different perspectives)?

Your collaborative report is what it sounds like: a report of how your group functioned together during this project. This will be similar to the collaborative report that you wrote for your Wikipedia project groups. However, given the larger scale of this project, the length of the collaborative report is longer and requires more in-depth explanation. Overall, this report should be between 3-5 pages. Your project logs should inform this report.

You are required to have the following information at the top of your report:

- Your name
- Your group name/number
- The date
- The words "Collaborative Report"

As you write your report, you should consider the following questions:

Overall Project

- What challenges did you face? How did you overcome them?
- What part of the project did you find the most rewarding?
- What was each member's greatest strength? Where does each member have room for growth?
- What surprised you most about your project?
- What did you learn from this experience?

Your Section

- What section of the research project were you the manager of? Detail your experience as manager:
 - Who did you work closest with for your section?
 - o Who in the group helped you facilitate the project most?
 - O Who kept in contact best?
 - o Who helped draw out strengths in others?
 - o How did you feel about your managerial role?
 - What made you feel more prepared? Less prepared?
- How long did it take you to finish the section you were manager of?
 - O What factors may have created setbacks?
 - What may have helped things move faster?
- How did you help with other sections of the project?

- o How do you feel about the performance of the other members in their sections?
- o What were some strengths or weaknesses that you found?

You can write about anything and everything you believe to be important concerning this project (including any difficulties you may have had with other group members or aspects of the project), as long as you discuss your experience in regard to the questions above. Remember, the soul of good writing is detail. Don't tell me you did "things" – tell me exactly which things, and what they were and how they worked.

This report is formal in terms of format:

Times New Roman, 12-point font, double-spaced, 1-inch margins.

It is informal in the sense that you can discuss your experience candidly.

3-5 pages in length.

If you prefer, you can fulfill this assignment by creating a video that addresses these same concerns. That can be in any format you wish. If you choose this option, make sure to include the same level of detail (or more!) as your printed document, and make sure it gets submitted properly.
