## Group Vacation Presentation

One of the three major presentations for this class is a group presentation. The presentation is worth $\mathbf{2 0}$ points or $20 \%$ of your final grade.

- For the presentation, your group will plan a vacation for the whole. For this vacation, you:
- Have a budget of no more than $\mathbf{\$ 1 5 0 0}$ per student. Less than that is okay but more is not.
- Must base all of your materials on realistic sources. This might include checking online prices or calling travel agencies. Nothing in your presentation should be made up. Because this will be a vacation for the class, consider (real) group discounts.
- Must tell the class where the class will go on the vacation, when the vacation will be, and how long the class will stay.
- Should give information about the destination(s) based on your experience or research.
- In addition, your presentation must:
- 15-20 minutes long.
- Include additional time (up to 5 minutes) for questions after your presentation is over. This is not included in the time limit above but is in addition to that time.
- Be given by groups of $\mathbf{3}$ students (unless otherwise okayed by me).
- Include approximately equal speaking time for each student.
- Include additional maps, brochures, pictures, and so forth that help to demonstrate your vacation destination. These must be made by a member of your group. You may not use materials not created by one of your group's members. This includes pictures!
- Be given only in English. Imagine the people listening to your group cannot understand Korean. This includes all written materials, maps, and anything else used during your presentation.

Your vacation will be graded on the following questions:

- Was the vacation well-planned? Did it seem reasonable?
- Was the vacation realistic based on the time and budget?
- Were the presenters able to answer questions about their vacation?
- Were the created materials helpful to the presentation?
- Were the presenters knowledgeable about their materials (especially their destination)?
- Was the presentation well practiced?
- Was the presentation clear and easy to understand?
- Were the materials correct (grammar, spelling, word choice, and pronunciation)?

After I have given a grade based on the above questions, the grade will then be adjusted based on two things:

- Student reactions:
- Students will vote for their favorite vacation. The group that receives the most votes will receive 1 bonus point. The group that receives the second most votes will receive .5 bonus points.
- Group member reactions:
- The members of your group will evaluate your individual performance during preparation time outside of class.

The group vacation presentations will be given on November $\mathbf{1 6}^{\text {th }}$ and $\mathbf{1 8}^{\text {th }}$. Groups and presentation times will be chosen today. You will have very little time to prepare for the presentations in class, so make sure to exchange contact information and make plans to meet outside of class time.
