#### Grading

Grading will be based on the following items. A score of 70 points or higher is necessary in order to pass this class. An "A" will be awarded to students who have scores higher than 70 points. An "A+" will be awarded to students who have scores higher than 85 points. All four assignments must be completed in order to pass the class.

• Final Writing and Listening Test: 30 points

• Presentation: 30 points

• Group work: 10 points

In addition to the above scores, students may also lose points for the following reasons:

Absence: -8 points (4 absences fails the class). If you must be absent, please tell
me at least one week in advance if possible. If you have an emergency, please
give me a signed document proving your reason for absence.

- Lateness: -1 point for 15 minutes or less, -2 points for between 15 and 40 minutes, and -5 for more than 40 minutes late. If you miss a class activity, you lose all the points for that activity.
- Class Participation: Writing and speaking will be assigned in class. Students may
  lose points on these if they do not participate or if they do not follow the
  assignment correctly.
- Poor Class Behavior: Up to -10 points.
- Late Assignments: Homework is due at the beginning of the next class after it is assigned. Late homework results in a 2-point deduction per week.

#### Classroom Behavior

The following behavior is expected in class. Not following these guidelines or doing something else that is inappropriate for class will result in a deduction from the student's final grade.

- Students are expected to speak English in class.
- Students should not speak when the instructor is speaking, during tests, or during presentations.
- Students are expected to participate in all classroom activities.
- Students may not use cell phones in class.
- Bathroom breaks during class are allowed. Please get up quietly and return to class quickly.

### Cheating

Cheating of any kind will not be tolerated in class. Students caught cheating during class will fail the assignment and possibly the class. Cheating includes (but is not

## limited to):

- Cutting and pasting information from a website.
- Copying from a book, magazine, or other published work.
- Copying from a friend or other student, or receiving help from a native speaker.
- Using an online translation website.

REMEMBER: Copying only one line of homework or just one answer is still cheating and may result in failure of the course.
