ENG 7800 Learning Transfer



Assignment Project



The Assignment Project is an opportunity to develop a new assignment with learning transfer in mind. You will be asked to create a new assignment from scratch or *significantly* alter a past assignment. The new assignment should be created to foster learning transfer in the course you'd use it in. In addition to creating the assignment, you'll also need to write a reflection explaining how

learning transfer is being facilitated and connecting to theories from class readings that demonstrate the mechanism by which it's been facilitated. You will present your final assignment along with how it's facilitating transfers to the class.

Requirements

- Projects should include a detailed explanation of the assignment along with any materials you would give students, such as handouts or assignment sheets.
- The reflective part of the project should be between 1500 and 3000 words (or the multimodal equivalent).
- All projects should be submitted via Google Drive in your shared folder for the class. Please name your assignment with your name, the class, and the assignment (e.g. Malcolm Reynolds ENG 7800 Assignment Project).

Objectives

- To apply learning transfer theory to classroom application.
- To explore methods for facilitating learning transfer.
- To build assignments with specific outcomes in mind.

Form

As with the Archaeology Projects, these projects can take the form of a traditional paper, or they can be presented in a multimedia format: a podcast, a video, a website, etc. The expectations for any form are the same: I expect a clear explanation of the assignment, supplemental materials, and a reflection on how the assignment facilitates learning transfer. Multimedia assignments can be dropped into Google Drive directly, or they can be uploaded to a different site and linked in a Google document.

Due Date

- First Drafts are due on Wednesday, February 26th
- Final Drafts are due on Wednesday, March 4th
- Presentations will be given on Wednesday,
 March 4th

Presentations

Presentations for the Assignment Project should be short and simple: explain your assignment concisely and explain how it connects to learning transfer theory. You are encouraged to use presentation software to organize your presentation and keep you on track. Presentations should be <u>no more than 5 minutes long</u>. Please practice your presentation in advance and make sure it fits within the time limit. After your presentation, you will be asked questions about your assignment by me and your peers.
