Develop Personal Pedagogy	Make sound and thoughtful pedagogical decisions independently that are based on both established research and personal experience.
Promote Digital Literacy	Promote and increase the critical use and creation of digital texts in our teaching and among our students.
Manage Plagiarism	Spot, stop, and address violations of academic integrity while considering the specific instance and the context of the violation.
Promote Student Success	Help our students to feel as though they belong to the NIU community and to succeed in their transition to university life.
