Hypertext Project

For the Hypertext Project, you will be asked to make a simple website. You are encouraged to use Wordpress if you haven't before, but you can also choose a different web



building platform or write the site from scratch using a program such as Dreamweaver or Aptana. The content of the site must be focused on you, but the specifics are open: The site could be a resume, a portfolio of academic or creative work, an autobiography, or a combination of those elements and others.

Content Requirements

The site must include:

- A minimum of three separate pages.
- A minimum of one image—aside from header, sidebar, or navigation images—per page.
- A minimum of three links per page—external links are encouraged.
- Consistent content. The image should be a single text, not multiple separate texts.

- Please create a document in your folder in Google Drive and put a link to your website in that file.
- If you are submitting built-fromscratch site and don't want to post publicly, you can create a zip folder of the HTML files and all supporting files and upload that to your folder in Google Drive.
- Please name files in Google Drive with your name, your class, and the assignment (e.g. Malcolm Reynolds ENG 3860 Hypertext).

Learning Objectives

- To enact basic visual and web design principles.
- To build a rhetorically effective online space.
- To explore the interplay of text, image, links, and other modes of meaning.

Reflection

With your site, please also submit a short reflection on the project. This assignment should also be submitted in your folder in Google Drive and must be a minimum of 500 words. The reflection should answer three questions:

- Why did I make the design choices I did?
- Why were these choices the best available?
- How did I learn something new in the creation of this project?
