ENG 3860 Composing in New Media



Video Project

For the Video Project, you will be asked to make a short "concept" video. In this video, you will explain a simple idea in a new or interesting way. The video should be clear, concise,



and easy for someone new to the concept to follow. Video projects can be completed alone or with a partner. The Video Project should be edited and include outside video, images, audio, and music. As with the Audio Project, the extent of the editing will depend on how much past experience you have had with video.

Content Requirements

The Video Project must include:

- A minimum of three outside video clips or images.
- A minimum of three outside sounds.
- A minimum of one piece of music.
- Edited video. It should not be a single take.
- Focus on a single concept.
- No more than 90 seconds of video (aim for 60 seconds).

Submission

- Please upload your Video Project to an online video platform (such as YouTube) and share a link to it in a document in your folder in Google Drive.
- If you are uncomfortable uploading to an online platform, you can upload the file directly into your folder in Google Drive.
- Name files with your name, the class, and the assignment (e.g. Malcolm Reynolds ENG 3860 Video Project).

Learning Objectives

- To integrate visuals and audio to make meaning.
- To work on basic video editing skills.
- To reflect on how making meaning in video might be different from audio or text.

Reflection

With your Video Project, please also submit a short reflection. This assignment should also be submitted in your folder in Google Drive and must be a minimum of 500 words. The reflection should answer three questions:

- Why did I make the editing choices I did?
- Why were these choices the best available?
- How did I learn something new in the creation of this project?

Grading

Your grade for the Video Project will be determined by the above criteria.

- D You do not meet the expectations for one to three of the criteria. All others are met.
- F You do not meet the expectations for more than three of the criteria.
